Facilities Selection and Needs Assessment

In coordination with Ukraine's Ministries of Health and Education, 20 schools and hospitals were pre-selected. Each site undergoes technical evaluation

2

Technical Specifications and Procurement

Following assessments, technical specs are prepared for each site, covering design, equipment, and installation requirements. All equipment will be sourced from **EU/EEA manufacturers** to ensure quality and reliability

3

Installation of Solar Power Plants

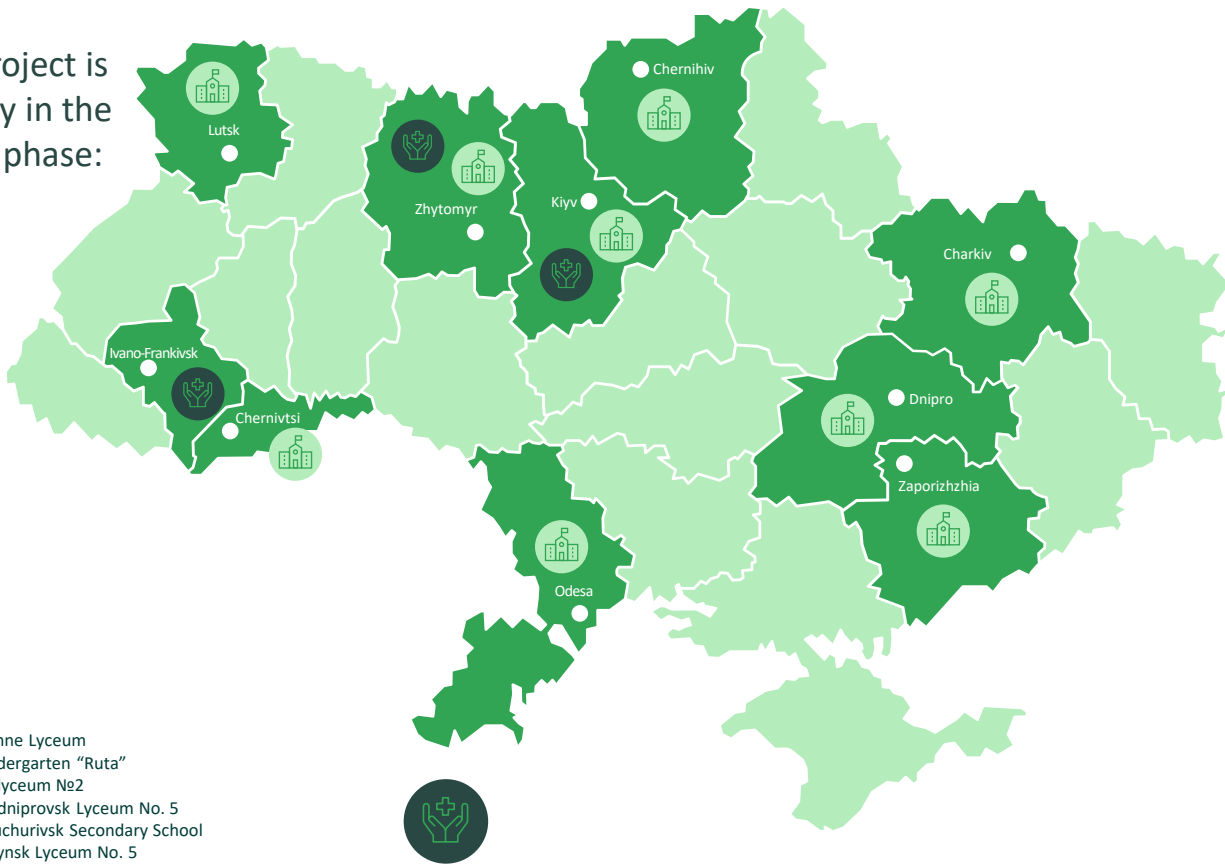
After procurement, design and installation will start at selected sites. Systems will include solar panels, batteries, and inverters to provide reliable power during blackouts

4

Further Roll-Out

Subject to cost savings or additional funding, the project has potential to be scaled up to cover more facilities across the country

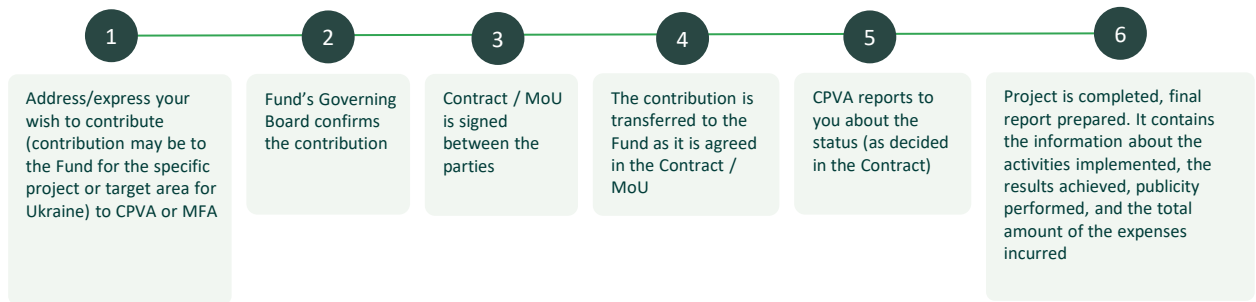

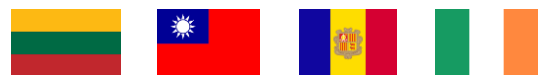
